National Science Center funding agency for basic research in Poland

- Co-founder of cOALition S: an initiative supporting full and immediate Open Access to research publications (Plan S)
- Driving force behind implementing Open Science policies in Poland
- Offers flexible financial incentives to facilitate Open Access to publications and research data (even after a grant ends)

- Enhancement of scientific and organizational management in the IIMCB, including Open Science







National

- One information center that reaches out to researchers
- Raising awareness among researchers about the Open Science concept, demands and benefits
- Limited access to resources and infrastructures to deposit research data (institutional level)
- Professional institutional support for researchers, such as clear internal Open Access policies, Data Stewards
